## Classroom and home workplace setting

Adapt the home workplace and the classroom setting

Teachers need to understand how to transform the school or home environment into a more productive and comfortable environment for students. To do this they must:

- find a space that is used only for working or studying, or that is used at least at certain times
- avoid sources of distraction
- have space to store necessary materials
- have a good lighting source
- be away from noises

Remember to check your work or study space, not only in terms of brightness, sound and space, but also with regard to the height of your chair, desk, computer (if you use it) and above all also plan breaks if you sit for a long time.

Exercise n.2: Understand the situation
