## Colors exercises

### What to do and what to avoid when writing your document colors

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#### Example:

#### Remember:

- Do not complementary colours with people with colour vision deficiency.
- Use a 10 to 15 percent tint background
- Put dark colors on light backgrounds, or the other way around
- Do not use very similar colours on one another
