- Record yourself several times in different situations and identify the factors that guarantee good understanding!

Reminder: importance of creating an understandable video.

- Students with special needs may have attention, comprehension or hearing difficulties.
- To create a video that is accessible to the majority, it is important to take into account certain parameters during the recording process as well as to provide subtitles.

- change your position in relation to the camera;
- turn around
- lowering and raising your voice;
- speak quickly/slowly;
- cover your mouth

Following these exercises, what will you pay attention to in order to record a video that is intelligible to everyone?

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Step 3 - Generate subtitles

For this exercise, use Ava or zoom and click to generate subtitles.

Tip: Introduce yourself! Tell your name, age, what you do for a living and who your family is.

Be careful, you will have to speak using these scenarios:

- talk fast
- speak slowly
- speak loudly
- speak softly
